Dribble Around CONCACAF Gold Cup Traffic with Florida 511

TALLAHASSEE —Tens of thousands of soccer enthusiasts will pack Raymond James Stadium for the [2017 Confederation of North, Central America and Caribbean Association Football \(CONCACAF\) Gold Cup](#) doubleheader in Tampa on Wednesday, July 12. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) encourages residents and visitors to use the [Florida 511 Traveler Information System](#) to find the best route to the stadium.

Panama plays Nicaragua at 6:30 p.m. and the United States takes on Martinique at 8:30 p.m.

Before leaving, soccer fans can check the statewide interactive road map on FL511.com for real-time traffic information in English or Spanish. Users can access up-to-the-minute information about current driving conditions, including traffic speeds, incident alerts, road closures and more. Drivers also can view traffic cameras showing current driving conditions near Raymond James Stadium on I-295, I-4 and I-75.

Fans can register on the website or free [mobile app](#) for a [My Florida 511](#) personalized services account to create a custom door-to-door route to Raymond James Stadium or other favorite destinations. Route-specific text and email alerts can include travel speeds, travel time estimates and traffic information.

Additional ways to receive information from Florida 511 include calling 511 toll-free from any phone in the state or following any of the statewide, regional or roadway-specific [Twitter](#) feeds feeds ([#FL511](#)), such as [@FL511 TampaBay](#), [@FL_511_I4](#) and [@FL511_I75](#).

FDOT encourages all drivers to visit the Florida 511 website before leaving or have a passenger check the mobile app to avoid using a phone while driving.
